Requirements for Early Childhood Teacher Education Program

Philosophy

A course dedicated to preparing adult learners must have as its guiding values the fundamental principles upon which Dr. Maria Montessori based her philosophy. The same principles that pertain to children's education need to be applied, whenever possible, to adults. By adhering to the same philosophy with our adult learners, students who take our course will develop a love for the Montessori principles and philosophy that will continue long past the completion of their credential.

We will apply the following principles in our program:

- * In following Montessori's concern for each student's freedom of choice, we are guided by a deep respect for each student's individual process of development.
- * Because Montessori emphasized each learner's active participation, this course focuses on the active participation of each student through such opportunities as written assignments, illustrated teaching manuals, peer demonstrations, evaluations, and material making.
- * Dr. Montessori felt that the process of development was much more important than the end product. Therefore, we foster an atmosphere of positive cooperation among all the individuals involved in the program. To implement this belief, we include closely supervised self-evaluation, constructive criticism, and emphasis on objective evaluation.

Practicum

The course requires a teaching practicum of 540 hours in an approved practicum site .

Evaluation

Final examinations are given: a) an exam on Montessori materials, b) an exam on Montessori principles and philosophy course, and c) one practical examination in which the student demonstrates the ability to use the Montessori materials and is able to discuss the philosophy and purposes underpinning the materials.

Each student compiles a portfolio meeting MACTE competencies, which is due at the end of the practicum.

Upon successful completion of the course and fulfillment of financial responsibilities, the program director will recommend the graduate for an AMS 3 -6 Early Childhood credential.

Adult learners with a college degree will receive a full Early Childhood Credential and those with only a high school diploma will receive an Associate Credential. An Associate Credential may be updated once a college degree is awarded.

Application Procedures

- 1. All applicants must be at least 18 years of age.
- 2. All applicants must complete an application and submit a required essay on the topic "Why I Wish to Take Montessori Training," along with the non-refundable application fee.
- A NOTARIZED copy of the applicant's high school diploma or, if a college graduate, an OFFI-CIAL college transcript from an ACCREDITED

- institution must be sent to Maitland Montessori School.
- The applicant must furnish two letters of reference.
- All applicants must meet on an individual basis with the Teacher Education Program Director, either by an informal, in-person meeting or by phone interview.

All procedures listed below must be completed <u>before</u> the student can begin the teacher education program.
